Japan is the 9th largest investor in Myanmar and the 3rd largest export market. The bilateral trade between the two countries has exceeded \$ 1.296 billion in this fiscal year. As situated in the geostrategic location in the region, Myanmar has ample room for economic growth and, as such, we hope Japan's public and private sectors will continue to invest in Myanmar.
